Weather, temperature, and humidity (in Surrey) *at least 2 weather reports	
<i>Quel temps fait-il à Surrey?</i>	<i>Il fait / Il y a / Il est...à Surrey</i>
<i>Quelle est la température à Surrey?</i>	<i>La température est (#) degrés.</i>
<i>Quelle est l'humidité à Surrey?</i>	<i>La température est de (#) degrés négatifs</i>
<i>Quelle est l'humidité à Surrey?</i>	<i>L'humidité est (#) pour cent.</i>
Weather in Your Francophone City (for the week) *at least 1 for each day	
If you research the city on a Tuesday, it will give you the weather for the next 7 days, so it will start on Wednesday, and end on next Tuesday. THIS IS OK! As long as you have the weather for each day of the week.	
<i>Quel temps fait-il à (Francophone city) pendant la semaine (during the week)?</i>	
<i>lundi...mardi...etc.</i>	
Par exemple : <i>Lundi, il fait beau. Mardi, il pleut. Mercredi...</i>
